HIV-associated dementia complex	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Acquired cognitive abnormality in ≥ 2 domains • Acquired abnormality in motor performance or behavioral change • Significant functional impairment • No clouding of consciousness or other confounding etiology, including active CNS opportunistic infection, psychiatric disorder or active substance abuse
HIV-associated minor cognitive-motor disorder (MCMD)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At least two symptoms: impaired attention or concentration, mental slowing, impaired memory, slowed movements, incoordination, personality change, and acquired cognitive-motor abnormality on neurological or neuropsychological testing • Functional impairment is mild • No evidence of another etiology
